## French furniture manufacturer

A family requirement:  
keeping the production in the heart of Bugey (Ain)

The head office has been located in Briord (Ain) since 1973. Since then, the site has evolved considerably but the Roset family has always wished to keep the company's headquarters here, out of loyalty to their family history and to those who participated in the evolution of the company and the region.

Our seats and other pieces of furniture are now produced in the 155,000m<sup>2</sup> of industrial space represented by our 5 factories located in Ain, Rhone and Isère. We are proud of the fact that our products are Made in France.

In the factory, our production methods make it possible to reduce the quantities of raw materials used, optimising processes in order to increase yield and limit scraps and waste. We use our wood shavings and dust to fuel a wood-fired boiler which completely heats our 45,000m<sup>2</sup> St-Jean-le-Vieux production site. The fumes from this burner are filtered using

an electro filter to be well below emission limit values. Everything is overseen by the DREAL (Direction Régionale de l'Environnement, de l'Aménagement et du Logement or Regional Department for the Environment, Living and Housing).

2022 has seen us achieve recognition by becoming a member of "La French Fab". The Roset Group supports French Industry and the "French touch" with the aim of accelerating its transformation and sustainable development. We collaborate with other players in the industry to ensure its prosperous future by making the professions that compose it attractive.

The Roset Group is like those who have helped make its name for the past 160 years: "briolands", inhabitants of the town of Briord, in Ain. The brand was born there and has settled there, just as we settle in our seats: comfortably and durably.



# Preserve French craftsmanship

Ligne Roset has been labeled EPV since 2022, for the excellence of its know-how and for its roots in Ain (OR ARA) since 1860. This label attests to the high degree of excellence of artisanal and industrial know-how of the family business.

Since its creation in 2005, the EPV label has highlighted unique companies that reconcile innovation and tradition, know-how and creation, work and passion, heritage and future, local and international. This state label is attached to the Ministry of Economy and Finance and awarded by the prefects of the region. Its management was entrusted to INMA (Institut National des Métiers d'Art) in 2019. It is the only State label awarded to a company for all its activity, guaranteeing the excellence of its know-how according to demanding eligibility criteria.

The Living Heritage Companies constitute an important part of the artisanal fabric and are proud ambassadors of French historical and future know-how.

Awarded for a period of five years, this label brings together manufacturers who share common values in their activities: the high performance of businesses and products, permanent attention to internal training, a technically and socially innovative approach, and a dynamic commercial strategy. It is a national network of companies of excellence also reconciling adaptability, responsiveness, innovation, and passion for the profession.



Whatever their size, reputation, and specialties, together they watch over a treasure: that of French manufacturing heritage. The EPV label is a real support for «made in France».

The Living Heritage Companies maintain their production activity in France, in sectors with high added value. Most of them are present on international markets and thus export emblematic French know-how. They are representative of the “made in France” spirit and forge the French economic and cultural identity. By calling on the know-how of a labeled company, customers and specifiers support the maintenance and development of these prestigious activities in France, to establish and consolidate long-term and non-relocated jobs. These companies can intervene on non-standard sites, to respond to the most original orders, to offer original and tailor-made solutions to meet the most specialized needs

and the most demanding customers. Perpetuating or reintroducing ancestral and original techniques, they also do not hesitate to innovate and invent new processes or products to meet current needs and standards. Another characteristic of EPVs is to train and encourage vocations to high-level professions. Labeled companies respond precisely to what employees are looking for today: meaning and values while defending the creation of quality and sustainable products, another criterion for EPV eligibility.

Trustees of a heritage, many Living Heritage Companies offer the public to discover their history, their profession, their achievements, by organizing visits to workshops, by opening museums, spaces for the presentation of collections. These visits are a way to share their passion with the public, in the privacy of their workshops.



## Edit a more sustainable design

6 Concerned about the issues that weigh on our resources, we implement best practices always rooted in our convictions, for a more "sustainable design".

### **Tapestry**

Tapestry is a French and historical know-how to the company. In addition to manual work, the Roset Group is investing in a new, latest-generation automatic quilting machine for the complex quilting of the Ruche (pictured) in 2022. The range of threads we use for the topstitching of the covers now meets the strict requirements of STANDARD 100 OEKO-TEX®.

### **Carpentry**

The woods we use come from a variety of sources. Most of our wood is reworked directly in our factories, these are all PEFC certified. The rest of the wood already delivered, processed, is not all certified. We are still working to improve this sourcing.

Chipboard or medium panels comply with international formaldehyde emission standards. Our waste is sorted, recycled, and optimized, 100% of wood waste is used to heat our factories.

### **Foam Cutter**

Polyurethane foams are controlled by CERTIPUR guaranteeing the non-use of heavy metals, or their use at limited thresholds, and no toxic discharge throughout the life cycle. We work for the development of vegetable and biodegradable foams, having a lower environmental impact.

### **Textile & Leather Cutting**

Kvadrat, Alcantara or even Gabriel; our fabric suppliers are now committed to a CSR approach.

In production, we optimize the cuts thanks to specialized software allowing the minimization of production waste.

All production scraps are revalued in other industries of the textiles and leather.

We also contribute to the economy internally by recycling our scraps. For example, Alcantara scraps are turned into tote bags for newcomers.

### **Bonding**

The harmlessness of the products and components chosen to protect the working conditions in the workshop and the living environments of the customers. Since 2003, we have been using 100% water-based glues and hydro lacquers, which are less polluting.

### **Assembly**

Our wadding is 100% EU origin. In 2020, our main supplier produces a wadding composed of 75% fibers obtained from the recycling of plastic bottles

Our other supplier is Oeko-tex Standard 100 certified for their wadding, which means that it ensures the production of materials or finished products free of toxic substances.
